Because of the challenge for some communities, back in 2021 we initiated a Deanery Social Concerns Roundtable that meets monthly on Zoom. This group is made up of representatives of the parishes of our deanery. One of the things the Roundtable did was to plan/host a High School Youth Retreat about Social Justice back in February. This was very well received and we had participants from all the deanery parishes. We are working on another one for this coming February. If you are interested in getting involved in a group that plans together, shares ideas and supports one another in the efforts of serving others, please consider joining us!
